Methods of Instruction

The Teaching and Lecture methods will form the vital means of instruction. This will manifest in narratives and analysis by the Lecturer at different lecture periods. Group discussions and dramatization by students on roles of diplomats in Foreign Service will also form method of course instruction.

Overview

There exist a nexus between National Interest, Foreign Policy, Diplomacy/diplomats and Foreign Service. In projecting her national interests to the outside world, Nigeria's foreign policy is articulated; this is projected diplomatically and tactically to the international community by Diplomats, who are deployed by Nigerian government on foreign missions/ service. Thus, this course examines Nigerian Foreign Service from its genesis, - 1957, few years to Nigerian independence till 2019. The course begins by highlighting the major concepts of Foreign Service, diplomacy and diplomat; plus the early foundations of Nigeria's Foreign Service. Rationale for the establishment of diplomatic relations, administrative structure of the foreign service; and general overview/analyses of Nigeria's foreign service and prospects form the main thrust of this course.

The course is part of the Department's thrust in exposing the students to initial efforts and challenges faced by the emerging Nigerian state in establishing its foreign service, which aimed to project her ideals to the comity of nations within the international system.

Objectives

The objectives of the course are to:

1 discuss the genesis/ early foundations of Nigerian Foreign Service

2 explain the rationale for establishment of diplomatic relations with other countries by Nigeria

3 describe the administrative structure of Nigeria's Foreign Service

4 analyze the characteristics of Nigerian Foreign Service under successive administrations from independence till 2019

5 highlight the privileges and immunities of diplomats on Foreign Service

6 discuss the consequences of abuse of diplomatic privileges and immunities by diplomats

7 explain the major tasks of Nigerian diplomats/ambassadors on foreign missions

8 explain the major differences between career and non- career diplomats

9 discuss the problems and prospects of Nigerian Foreign Service since independence.

2 identify and discuss the major actors in Nigeria's Foreign Service

3 discuss the major characteristics of Foreign Service of each administration in Nigeria from 1960 to 2019

4 highlight the major diplomatic privileges and immunities enjoyed by diplomats on Foreign Service

5 explain qualities of a good diplomat; and the processes of reception/recall of a diplomat

6 describe the administrative structure of Nigeria's Foreign Service

7 discuss the major problems facing Nigeria's Foreign Service

8 evaluate the major tasks of Nigerian diplomats and ambassadors on foreign missions

9 highlight prospects of Nigeria's Foreign Service in the coming years.

Course Contents

The major concepts: Foreign Service, diplomacy/diplomats defined and explained. Genesis and early foundation of Nigeria's Foreign Service, 1957-September 1960. Development of Nigeria's Foreign Service and rationale for the establishment of diplomatic relations. Who are on Foreign Service? Diplomats: Appointment, Reception and Recall of diplomats on Foreign Service.

Administrative Structure of Nigeria's foreign missions, general overview of Nigeria's Foreign Service under successive administrations, 1960-2019; diplomatic privileges and immunities and their abuses. Tasks of Nigerian diplomats/ambassadors on Foreign missions, career versus non-career diplomats; problems and prospects of Nigeria's Foreign Service, etc.
